But what if we were to embrace a warrior mentality and go on the offense, not for personal or political gains but for the sake of bringing God's light into this darkness? And what if we viewed Paul's [Eph. 6:10-18](#) spiritual armor as applying to both offense and defense?

Could we dare to go up against evil, in prayer and various actions, as in [II Cor. 10:3-5](#)? Can we believe that the [Mt. 16:18](#) “gates of hell” will not prevail against us as we demolish the strongholds of power and pride that handicap Christians and churches, even to abandoning our altars?
