"Kingdom" in the New Testament

The Greek <u>basileia</u> is a feminine noun and Strong's G932 which appears 162 times in the NT. It is translated "kingdom" and is the main topic of this study. However, considering its other forms will help us gain a better sense of its meaning and they are:

- The masculine noun form and Strong's G935, <u>basileus</u>, appears 118 times in the NT, and speaks of a king or one who rules. A kingdom is the dominion of one who rules.
- The verb, Strong's G936, <u>basileuō</u>, 21 times in NT and means to reign

Matthew

Also, basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strong's G935, is used 23 times in Matthew

- 3:2 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near."
- <u>4:8</u> Again, the devil took him up to a high place and showed him all the <u>kingdoms</u> of the world along with all their splendor.
- 4:17 From that time Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."
- $\underline{4:23}$ Jesus went about in all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the <u>kingdom</u>, and healing every kind of disease and sickness -
- <u>5:3</u> "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- <u>5:10</u> Blessed are those who have been persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the <u>kingdom of heaven</u>.

- <u>7:21</u> Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter into the <u>kingdom of heaven</u>, but only whoever does the will of my Father who is in heaven.
- 8:11 I tell you, many will come from the east and the west, and they will recline at the table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven.

- <u>13:11</u> Jesus answered and said to them, "You have been given the privilege of understanding mysteries of the <u>kingdom of heaven</u>, but to them it is not given.
- 13:19 When anyone hears the word of the <u>kingdom</u> but does not understand it, then the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is the seed that was sown beside the road.
- 13:24 Jesus presented another parable to them. He said, "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field.
- <u>13:31</u> Then Jesus presented another parable to them. He said, "The <u>kingdom of heaven</u> is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field.

- 21:31 Which of the two sons did his father's will?" They said, "The first one." Jesus said to them, "Truly I say to you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes will enter the kingdom of God before you do.
- <u>21:43</u> Therefore I say to you, the <u>kingdom of God</u> will be taken away from you and will be given to a nation that produces its fruits.
- $\underline{22:2}$ "The <u>kingdom of heaven</u> is like a certain king who prepared a marriage feast for his son. (See $\underline{1-14}$)
- 23:13 But woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! You shut the <u>kingdom of heaven</u> against people. For you do not enter it yourselves, and neither do you allow those about to enter to do so.

- <u>24:7</u> For nation will rise against nation, and <u>kingdom</u> against <u>kingdom</u>. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places.

Mark

Also, basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strong's G935, is used 12 times in Mark

- 1:14 KJV says "Now after that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God," but others don't have "kingdom" there, simply "gospel of God" or "the good news" etc. I don't think "kingdom" is in the Greek.
- 1:15 -- Jesus came into Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God, 15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the <u>kingdom of God</u> is near. Repent and believe in the gospel."
- $\underline{3:24}$ If a $\underline{kingdom}$ is divided against itself, that $\underline{kingdom}$ cannot stand.
- 4:11 He said to them, "To you is given the mystery of the kingdom of God. But to those outside everything is in parables,
- 4:26 And he said, "The <u>kingdom of God</u> is like a man who sows his seed on the ground. (See 4:26-29)
- 4:30-31 And he said, "To what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use to explain it? 31 It is like a mustard seed which, when it is sown, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth. (See 4:30-32)
- <u>6:23</u> He swore to her saying, "Whatever you ask of me, I will give you, up to half of my <u>kingdom</u>."
- 9:1 "Truly I say to you, there are some of you who are standing here who will not taste death before they see the <u>kingdom of God</u> come with power."
- 9:47 If your eye causes you to stumble, tear it out. It is better for you to enter into the <u>kingdom of God</u> with one eye, than to have two eyes and to be thrown into hell,

- 10:14-15 But when Jesus noticed it, he was very displeased and said to them, "Permit the little children to come to me, and do not forbid them, because to such ones belongs the kingdom of God. 15 Truly I say to you, whoever will not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will definitely not enter it."

Luke

Also, basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strong's G935, is used 11 times in Luke

- 1:33 He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and there will be no end to his kingdom."
- <u>4:5</u> Then the devil was leading Jesus up to a high place and he showed him all the <u>kingdoms</u> of the world in an instant of time.
- 4:43 But he said to them, "I must also preach the good news about the <u>kingdom of God</u> to many other cities, because this is the reason I was sent here."
- <u>6:20</u> Then he looked at his disciples, and said, "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.
- <u>7:28</u> I say to you, among those born of women, no one is greater than John, yet the least important person in the <u>kingdom of God</u> is greater than he is."
- <u>8:1</u> It happened soon afterwards that Jesus began traveling around to different cities and villages, preaching and proclaiming the good news about the <u>kingdom of God</u> and the twelve went with him,

(See <u>18-30</u>)
- 19:11-15 As they heard these things, he continued speaking and told a parable, because he was near to Jerusalem, and they thought that the kingdom of God was about to appear immediately. 12 He said therefore, "A certain nobleman went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom and then to return. - 15 It happened when he came back again, having received the kingdom, he commanded the servants to whom he had given the money to be called to him, that he might know what profit they had made by doing business. (19:11-27)
- <u>21:10</u> Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and <u>kingdom</u> against <u>kingdom</u>.
- $\underline{21:31}$ So also, when you see these things happening, you know that the <u>kingdom of God</u> is near. (See <u>5-36</u>)
- 22:16-18 For I say to you, I will not eat it again, until it is fulfilled in the <u>kingdom of God</u>." 17 Then Jesus took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he said, "Take this, and share it among yourselves. 18 For I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine again, until the <u>kingdom of God</u> comes."
- 22:29-30 I give to you a <u>kingdom</u>, even as my Father has given a <u>kingdom</u> to me, 30 that you may eat and drink at my table in my <u>kingdom</u>. And you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel. (See 24-30)

- 23:42 And he added, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." (39-43)
- <u>23:51</u> (he had not agreed with the decision and their action), from Arimathea, a Jewish city, who was waiting for the <u>kingdom of God</u>. (See <u>50-51</u>)

John

Also, basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strongs G935, is used 16 times in John

- <u>3:3-5</u> Jesus replied to him, "Truly, truly, unless someone is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."
- 4 Nicodemus said to him - 5 Jesus replied, "Truly, truly, unless someone is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter into the <u>kingdom of God</u>. (See <u>1-21</u>)
- 18:36 Jesus answered, "My <u>kingdom</u> is not of this world. If my <u>kingdom</u> were part of this world, then my servants would fight so that I would not be given over to the Jews. But now my <u>kingdom</u> is not from here." (See <u>28-40</u>)

Acts

Also, basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strongs G935, is used 20 times in Acts

- <u>1:3</u> After his suffering, he presented himself alive to them with many convincing proofs. For forty days he appeared to them, and he spoke about the <u>kingdom of God</u>.
- $\underline{1:6}$ When they were assembled together they asked him, "Lord, is this the time you will restore the <u>kingdom</u> to Israel?" (See <u>6-8</u>)
- 8:12 But when they believed what Philip preached about the gospel concerning the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women. (See 4-13)
- <u>14:22</u> They kept strengthening the souls of the disciples and encouraging them to continue in the faith, saying, "We must enter into the <u>kingdom of God</u> through many sufferings." (See <u>21-23</u>)
- <u>19:8</u> Paul went into the synagogue and spoke boldly for the space of three months. He was leading discussions and persuading people about the things concerning the <u>kingdom</u> of God.
- $\underline{20:25}$ And now, look, I know that you all, among whom I went about preaching the <u>kingdom</u>, will see my face no more.

- 4:20 For the <u>kingdom of God</u> does not consist in talk but in power. (See 18-21)
- 6:9-10 Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the <u>kingdom of God</u>? Do not believe lies. The sexually immoral, idolaters, adulterers, male prostitutes, those who practice homosexuality, 10 thieves, the greedy, drunkards, slanderers, and swindlers—none of them will inherit the kingdom of God. (See 7-11)
- <u>15:24</u> Then will be the end, when Christ will hand over the <u>kingdom to God</u> the Father. This is when he will abolish all rule and all authority and power. (See 20-28)

basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strongs G935, is used 1 time in II Cor.

Galatians

5:21 - envy, drunkenness, drunken riots, and other things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who practice such things will not inherit the <u>kingdom of</u> God. (See 19-25)

Ephesians

<u>5:5</u> - For you can be certain that no sexually immoral, impure, or greedy person, that is, an idolater, has any inheritance in the <u>kingdom of Christ</u> and God.

Colossians

- $\underline{1:13}$ He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and transferred us to the <u>kingdom</u> of his beloved Son. (See $\underline{9-14}$)
- <u>4:11</u> and also Jesus who is called Justus. These alone of the circumcision are my fellow workers for the <u>kingdom of</u> God. They have been a comfort to me.

I Thessalonians

2:12 - that you should walk in a manner that is worthy of God, who calls you into his own <u>kingdom</u> and glory. (See 11-12)

II Thessalonians

<u>1:5</u> - This is a sign of God's righteous judgment. The result is that you will be considered worthy of the <u>kingdom of God</u> for which you suffer. (See <u>3-7</u>)

I Timothy

basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strongs G935, is used <u>3 times in I Timothy</u>

II Timothy

- 4:1 I give this solemn command before God and Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and because of his appearing and his <u>kingdom</u>:
- <u>4:18</u> The Lord will rescue me from every evil deed and will save me for his heavenly <u>kingdom</u>. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Hebrews

Also, basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and
Strongs G935, is used <u>7 times in Hebrews</u>

- $\underline{1:8}$ But about the Son he says, "Your throne, God, is forever and ever. The scepter of your $\underline{\text{kingdom}}$ is the scepter of justice.
- <u>11:33</u> It was through faith that they conquered <u>kingdoms</u>, worked justice, and received promises. They stopped the mouths of lions.
- <u>12:28</u> Therefore, receiving a <u>kingdom</u> that cannot be shaken, let us be grateful and in this manner worship God with reverence and awe.

James

<u>2:5</u> - Listen, my beloved brothers, did not God choose the poor of the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the <u>kingdom</u> that he promised to those who love him?

I Peter

basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strongs G935, is used 2 times in I Peter

II Peter

1:11 - In this way an entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will be richly granted to you. (See 1-11)

Revelation

Also, basileus, the masculine noun form of King, and Strongs G935, is used <u>66 times in Revelation</u>

- 1:6 he has made us a kingdom, priests for his God and Father—to him be the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen. (kjv says "he has made us kings, priests"
- 1:9 I, John—your brother and the one who shares with you

in the suffering and <u>kingdom</u> and patient endurance that are in Jesus—was on the island called Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony about Jesus.

- 5:9-10 They sang a new song: "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals. For you were slaughtered, and with your blood you purchased people for God from every tribe, language, people, and nation. 10 You made them a kingdom and priests to serve our God, and they will reign on the earth."
- 11:15 Then the seventh angel sounded his trumpet, and loud voices spoke in heaven and said, "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ. He will reign forever and ever."
- 12:10 Then I heard a loud voice in heaven: "Now have come the salvation, the power, the <u>kingdom of our God</u>, and the authority of his Christ. For the accuser of our brothers has been thrown down, the one who accused them before our God day and night.
- <u>16:10</u> Then the fifth angel poured out his bowl on the throne of the beast, and darkness covered its <u>kingdom</u>. They chewed on their tongues because of the pain. (9-11)
- <u>17:12</u> The ten horns that you saw are ten kings who have not yet received a <u>kingdom</u>, but they will receive authority as kings for one hour together with the beast.
- <u>17:17</u> "For God has put it in their hearts to execute His purpose by having a common purpose, and by giving their <u>kingdom</u> to the beast, until the words of God will be fulfilled. (nasb)
