HOW IT WORKS

The prophetic word or insight can come in different ways. First is by God's spirit speaking directly through words, thoughts and insights; by dreams or visions; or by Him applying a scripture to "now," for example.

However, one can also have a prophetic sense of things through gifting that instructs them about where things are going based on past and present actions and directions. The life experiences of years enriches that. We need that too.

Both are of Him and are for His Body. And either can produce a message in the spirit of Neh. 9:26 (last post), which is to turn God's people back to Him, or for edification, exhortation or consolation as in I Cor. 14:3 (nasb).


THE QUESTIONS
