## His Light in Us

<u>Heb. 1:3a</u> says, "The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being" (niv). We are called to be like Him and to radiate His Presence.

Eph. 4:13 says we are to mature "until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ" (nasb).

God intends for His spectacular glory to be on full display in the Church as we choose to make Him our god (see Chapter 1) and surrender to His rule, displaying His character for all to see.

Do we dare to believe that "the eyes of our heart can be enlightened, that we may know the hope to which he has called us, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people," as in Eph. 1:18? niv

Consider II Cor. 4:4-6. In our dark moments, do we dare to cry out to the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness, and made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ."? niv
