4. I/we take the Great Commission (Mt. 28:18-20) seriously. - -. We live with the sense of being sent into the world, as Jesus was sent into the world. (John 17:18) - - We have a knowledge of and regularly experience the spiritual gifts (I Cor. 12) - -.
5. Matthew 6:19-24 describes my/our attitude toward money and possessions. We trust God to supply our needs (Philip. 4:19). We are free of worry - -
6. Our homes confirm the truths of Eph. 5:22-33, because our husbands love their wives as Christ loved the Church and our wives submit to their husbands. - - We are known to our neighbors as those who only use our mouth to speak wholesome words that can edify others. No complaining, no gossip, no slander, no angry, selfish outbursts. (Eph. 4:29)
